Introduction

The University of Balochistan (henceforth, UoB), Quetta, is the oldest and most prominent institution of higher learning in the province. Established in 1970, its history is deeply intertwined with the development of Balochistan itself. Since its inception, the university has played a pivotal role in educating and training the region's human resources to meet the evolving needs of society and industry.



Early Years and the Foundation

The establishment of the University of Balochistan marked the beginning of its academic journey with the enactment of the 1970 ordinance and the launch of its initial faculties and departments. The University came into being with the promulgation of the University of Balochistan Ordinance 1970. The university initially occupied 150 acres of land at the Mineral Technology College and commenced its academic mission initially with two faculties: the faculty of science comprised of Physics, Chemistry, Geology, and Mathematics departments. The faculty of Arts offered programs in English, Urdu, Economics, Political Science, Sociology, Social Work, Education, Commerce, and Islamic Studies.

With a modest faculty of 104 members, the university also had a constituent college and an affiliated medical college. In its early years, the federal government established three vital study centers within the university: the Pakistan Study Center, the Balochistan Study Center, and the Mideast Study Center. Furthermore, nine-degree colleges (eight for boys and one for girls) were affiliated with the university, expanding its reach across the province. The university library initially held a collection of 26,508 books.

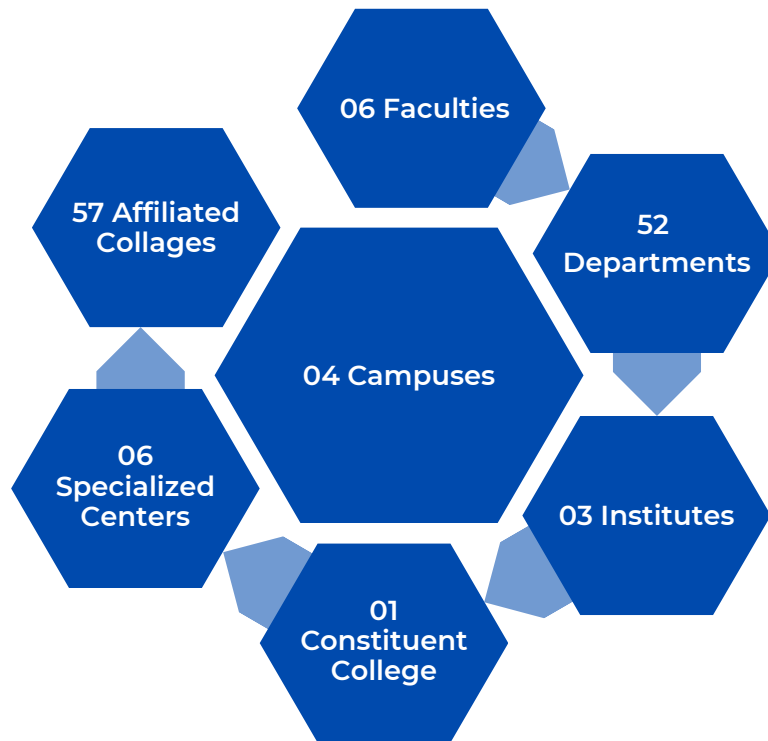
In 1996, The Balochistan Assembly passed the University of Balochistan Act 1996, solidifying its legal framework. Later, in 2022, a unified act governing all public sector universities in Balochistan was passed, streamlining higher education governance in the province.

Present Statistics:

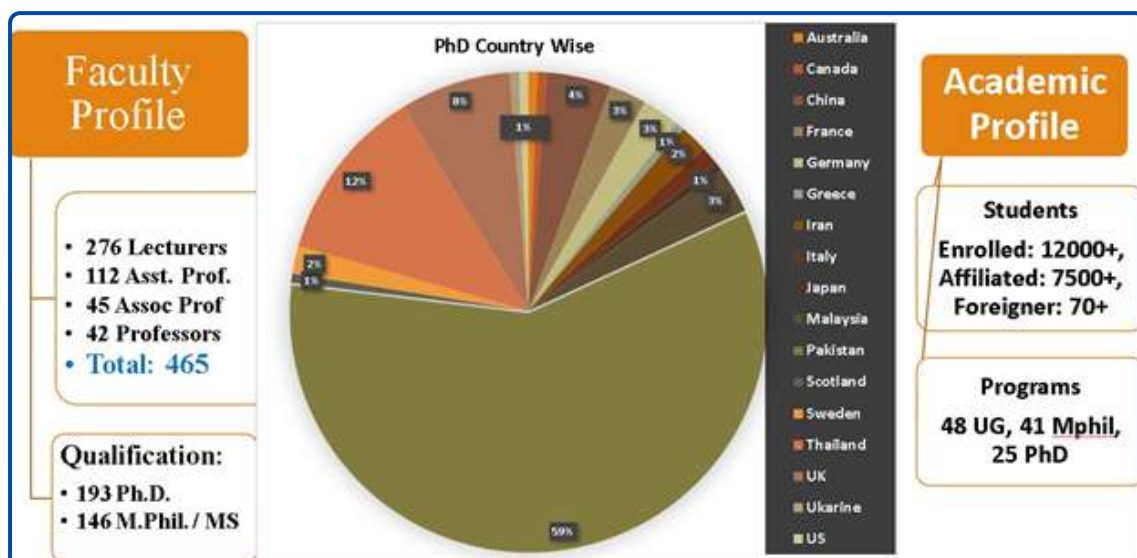
Currently there are 06 Faculties, 52 Departments, 139 programs, 06 Specialized Centers, 57 Affiliated Colleges, 03 Institutes, 04 Campuses, 01 Constituent Law, and College at Quetta.

The University has 465 + teaching faculty members out of which 193 are PhD's, whereas, more than 12000 students are enrolled in the main campus and sub campuses.

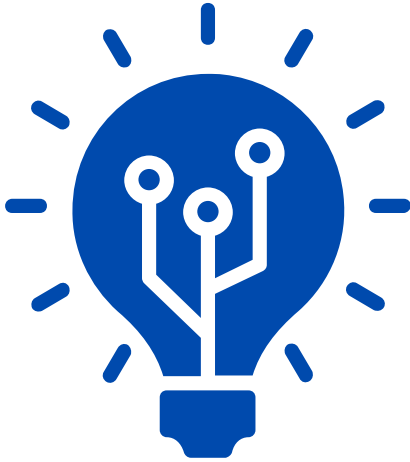

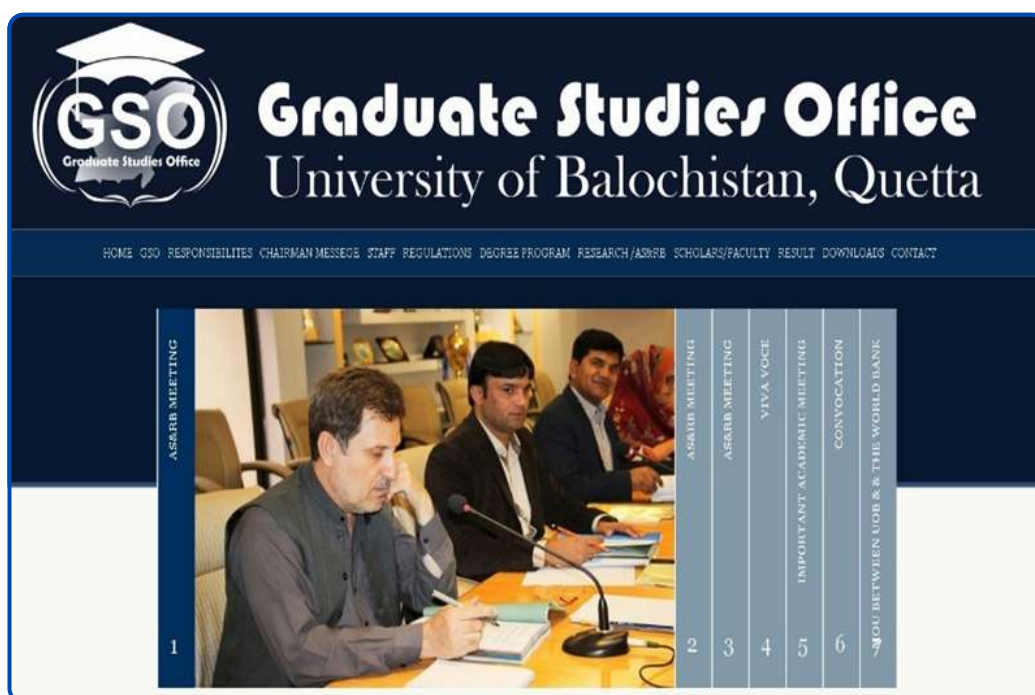
Graduate Studies Office (GSO)

The GSO is the central administrative body responsible for overseeing postgraduate programs, including M.Phil and Ph.D. studies, at the University of Balochistan.

Typical Roles and Responsibilities of the Graduate Studies Office

1. Provides administrative coordination within the academic affairs of departments, faculties, centers, institutes and all relevant offices to accomplish the mission of UoB: postgraduate education.
2. Oversees and coordinates all postgraduate programs at UoB.
3. Maintains Maintenance of postgraduate student records and periodic reports for monitoring the progress of students.
4. Administers the academic processes and events within the Graduate Studies office including monitoring of students' programs of Study, management of students' completion of research requirements (i.e., synopsis, presentation, publication, thesis).\
5. Coordinate & forward the grievances, appeals of the students, departments, institutes and centres for permission to relevant board/committee.
6. Serve as a liaison between the departments, centres, institutes and AS&RB, referring matters to the faculty or its committees as needed; informing the faculty of graduate education related policies, deadlines, and programs as appropriate; and forwarding recommendations, nominations, and other information from the faculty to the appropriate board/committee.
7. Serves as a point of contact for postgraduate students, departments, faculties, centers and AS&RB members.
8. Serve as a postgraduate program's representative on university governance committees, as appropriate.

- 9.Enforces regulations of the university and implementation of AS&RB minut postgraduate-level course curricular changes, new graduate program approvals and policy development.
- 10.Promotes and stimulates academic research working in collaboration with departments, faculties, centers, institutes and relevant offices.
- 11.Serves on various internal and external committees as directed by the Registrar.
- 12.Promotes a positive image and maintains effective relationships with the Office of the Registrar by representing the office at various meetings, communicating with university personals, faculty, staff, and students in matters related to postgraduate academic affairs.
- 13.Ensures that miscellaneous assignments related to postgraduate academic affairs are completed in the best interest of the University by accepting and accomplishing tasks, which are delegated by the Registrar.
- 14.Provides written criteria to each student, upon entry, of what constitutes acceptable progress through the program and the grounds for the student's termination from it.
- 15.Orients and counsels postgraduate students with respect to program and degree requirements until a permanent supervisor is selected and assist as necessary.
- 16.Facilitates a program of professional development activities for graduate students within the program.
- 17.Provide periodic reports on the program and data to the Registrar Office.

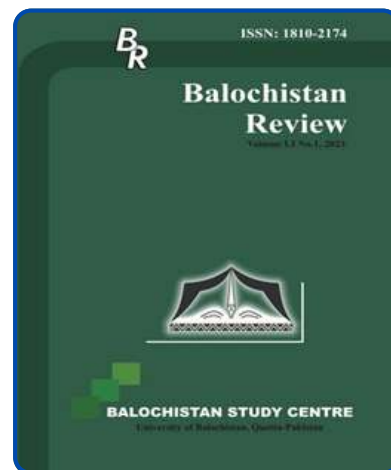
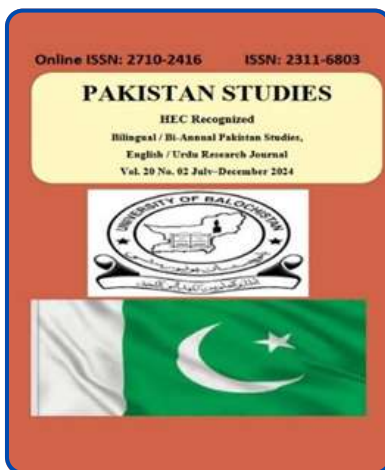

Central Library:

Libraries play a vital role in the academic life of a university. The fundamental role of the library being educational is that it should not be considered as a mere storehouse of books, but as a dynamic instrument of education. Similarly, the Central Library of the University is organized on these lines. The library collections support not only every course in the curriculum but also include a selected stock of general material of books, periodicals, publications, newspapers, e-catalogs etc. The total number of books in the Central Library is over 200,000. The whole library system is being computerized and online library service will be available through a network after the completion of the computerization process. Many International Research Journals are also available on Digital Library (provided by Higher Education Commission and research articles of interest can also be downloaded).

The University of Balochistan has access to digital library via PERN to provide researchers, faculty members and students of the University access to the International scholarly literature. The facility is based on electronic (online) delivery system. The Digital Library also provides access to high quality peer-reviewed journals database and articles on a wide range of disciplines. The facility could be availed by the faculty members and students at the University. The facility is accessible through the University of Balochistan internet/intranet. With Digital Library access, thousands of e-Resources including e-Books, e-Journals and other online resources are accessible.

2. Entrepreneurship Programs Expansion: With the launch of the BIC, ORIC aims to increase the scale of startup support, providing additional resources, networking events and investment opportunities for entrepreneurs.

ORIC Key Reflections:

Research and Innovation Advancement

ORIC's efforts to streamline the research proposal review process, coupled with the approval of 170 M.S./M.Phil. and Ph.D. research synopses, highlight its commitment to facilitating quality research. Collaborative research initiatives with renowned organizations such as ACT, Islamic Relief Pakistan (IRP) and Helping Hand for Relief and Development (HHRD) demonstrate ORIC's capacity to foster impactful partnerships. These initiatives have the potential to address critical societal challenges, such as disaster risk reduction, sustainable development, and poverty alleviation.

Capacity Building and Academic Development

ORIC has successfully organized a range of workshops, conferences and seminars, addressing critical areas such as digital learning, character mastery, and linguistic research. These initiatives have not only enhanced the skills of faculty and students but also positioned UoB as a hub for intellectual discourse and academic collaboration. The impactful discussions from events like the Rectors' Conference and the 10th International Conference of the Linguistics Association of Pakistan have opened new avenues for research and leadership development.

Entrepreneurship and Innovation Ecosystem

The completion of the National Incubation Center (NIC) project and the launch of the Business Incubation Center (BIC) underscore ORIC's dedication to fostering an entrepreneurial culture at UoB. By supporting startups and providing mentorship, resources and industry connections, ORIC is laying the groundwork for a sustainable innovation ecosystem. Initiatives such as DigiBizz further amplify this effort, equipping students with essential digital skills for the modern economy.

Resolving Research Project Challenges

ORIC has demonstrated resilience in addressing outstanding issues related to National Research Program for Universities (NRPU) projects. By coordinating with relevant stakeholders and ensuring compliance with HEC requirements, ORIC has resolved or made significant progress on several critical cases. This proactive approach not only reinstates trust in UoB's research administration but also paves the way for future collaborations and funding opportunities.

Strategic Vision and Institutional Growth

Through the submission of a comprehensive one-year progress report to the Chancellor's Office, ORIC has articulated a clear vision for transforming UoB into a research-centric institution. The report's strategic recommendations provide a roadmap for improving research infrastructure, enhancing faculty engagement, and establishing robust international partnerships.

Challenges and Future Directions

Despite these achievements, certain challenges persist, including pending NRPU project issues and the need to strengthen the online submission system for research proposals. Additionally, scaling the operations of the newly launched Business Incubation Center and ensuring consistent funding for initiatives will require continued focus.

Moving forward, ORIC aims to:

1. Expand its portfolio of collaborative research initiatives and MOUs with national and international partners.
2. Enhance the capacity of faculty and students through targeted training programs and workshops.
3. Strengthen the startup ecosystem by leveraging industry partnerships and creating more opportunities for budding entrepreneurs.
4. Address administrative challenges to ensure the seamless execution of research projects and funding programs.

Summary

ORIC's performance over the reporting period is a testament to its unwavering dedication to fostering a culture of research, innovation, and entrepreneurship. By addressing societal challenges, equipping the next generation of researchers and innovators, and building strong industry and academic partnerships, ORIC is not only contributing to the academic growth of UoB but also driving positive change in the broader community.

The progress achieved so far lays a solid foundation for future endeavors. ORIC remains committed to its mission of empowering UoB to emerge as a leading institution in research and innovation, making a tangible impact at local, national, and global levels.

- 3.Overall, GIL has completed 20 projects, with 13 ongoing, including Management Information Systems (MIS) and Financial Management Information Systems (FMIS) for the Municipal Corporation Quetta, a Water Filtration Plant for Public Health Engineering, and a coordination dashboard for local government.
- 4.GIL has been instrumental in promoting and providing training on AI based technologies and digital interventions through Internet of things (IoT).

Introduction

To support and strengthen quality higher education and Research, UoB recognizes and further emphasizes the role of ICT in higher education and R&D. The UoB IT infrastructure is connected via PERN (Pakistan Education and Research Network). This UoB IT infrastructure includes In-Campus network connectivity (through fiber optics, UTP & wireless WiFi Smart University Campus Blanket Coverage), computer labs that facilitate providing faculty/students the access to internet and to digital library (E-Books, E-journals etc). Smart Classroom and Video conferencing facility is provided which is facilitating interactive learning, through which online lectures/seminars/conferences/meetings/events etc. are organized in different universities/institutions/organizations, while the students and faculty attend them locally in UoB, with interactive questions and answers sessions. Furthermore, another important facility is that the faculty and students can download the latest Microsoft software products (via HEC-Microsoft Strategic Education Alliance Agreement).

PERN2 (Pakistan Education and Research Network):

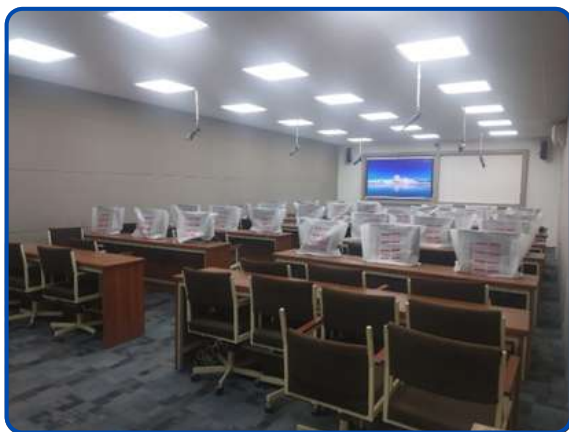
Presently UoB IT network is directly connected @620Mbps (allocated internet bandwidth) through PERN2 (Pakistan Education and Research Network) that is a national research and education network of Pakistan which connects premiere educational and research institutions of the country. PERN has strengthened and equipped our faculty/students to focuses on collaborative research, knowledge sharing, resource sharing, and distance learning by connecting people through the use of Intranet and Internet resources.

Achievements (2024)

1. Launch of in-house developed Web based software for the semester system lifecycle. This software has been named DIMS (Departmental Information Management System) and has been developed by DIT team without any cost using open-source technologies. DIMS is an integrated software system that is linked with Fee challans, Admission System and empowers each academic department to manage its programs semester-wise along with registering students into each program semester, adding / maintaining courses, faculty members, students, fee-structure, student attendance, student grading and transcripts etc. Department wise implementation has already been started at UoB, whereas already orientation sessions at BACT have been organized for the Principals of Government colleges to adopt DIMS.
2. Launch of in-house developed web-based software system for Sports. This system facilitates registering and submitting membership requests online, and one can book game slots online. Presently this system is used for booking cricket ground slots, however, soon all other game slots will be booked through this system.
3. PERN (Pakistan Education and Research Network) connectivity work has been started in Mastung campus UoB. This will greatly benefit the campus in terms of internet/intranet, access to digital libraries and research activities.
4. Smart Classroom equipped with technological infrastructure has been completed, under Transformation of Higher Education Institutions through the HEC-Smart Classroom project, one smart classroom has been established at UoB main campus whereas, another smart classroom has been established in Kharan Campus UoB. The live and interactive smart classrooms facilitate in faculty sharing along with e-learning and VDI facilities to the Main and branch site. This Platform is to fortify the distance and blended learning.



Development Projects

The various development projects are being carried out under the supervision of Director General (Engineering & Works). The details of the development projects and development activities carried out during the period are given in table as:

1	Centralized Classrooms Complex To overcome the deficiency of Classrooms and to facilitate the students' academic activities, a classrooms complex with hundreds of classrooms is under construction in the campus.
2	Main Library Expansion The University Central Library was constructed in the nineteen eighties to accommodate the students' requirements of that time. The Central Library needed expansion for the users of present enrolled students. The Central Library Expansion block is in construction completion stage.
3	Students' Facilitation Centre To facilitate the visitor students without entry in the campus and from one point accessed directly from outside of the campus, a student's facilitation center block has been constructed.
4	Students' Cafeteria The oldest University with thousands of students' strength was deficient in the facility of Students Cafeteria. A Students Cafeteria Building as per students' present strength requirements is on the completion phase.
5	Dismantling and Re-construction of Boys Hostel old Two Blocks Hon'ble Chancellor visited university Boys Hostels and ordered for dismantling and reconstruction of Boys Hostels very old two blocks No.1 and No.2. The reconstruction of Students Hostel Block No. 1 and Hostel Block No.2 are in progress.
6	Hostel for Boys To accommodate the boys' students coming from all over the province, another hostel block having 200 boarding students capacity is in the completion phase.

7	Mess for Boys Hostels To facilitate the boys' students boarding in all hostels Blocks, a building with Messing facility to accommodate the Students in all Boys Hostel Blocks is on the completion phase.
8	IT Facilitation Centre Information Technology is the hub of university academic activities. University IT was lacking the infrastructure facility. The University IT Facilitation Centre has been constructed and now in completion phase.
9	Renovation of Sports Complex University Gymnasium and Squash Courts were renovated and rehabilitated for the sports activities of Students and Faculty.
10	Solarization of Main Campus and Sub Campuses Phase-II University with the funding support of Higher Education Commission, Islamabad has initiated a project to solarize the left-over electricity consumption in the main campus and Jungle Bagh Campus. This 400 KW solarization project reduces the monthly financial burden coming from electricity charges.
11	Construction of Boundary Wall & Main Gate for HEC Regional Centre Quetta University of Balochistan has supported the Higher Education Commission, Islamabad in acquiring land and constructing boundary Wall with main gates for its Regional Centre at Quetta with HEC's own funding. All three other provinces have already developed Regional Centers at their Provincial Headquarters. HEC regional Centre at Quetta will be the Centre for development and strengthening of higher education in the province.

Entrusted Responsibility By HEC

HEC has entrusted UoB based on its credibility and previous performance to construct new building of HEC Regional center in Quetta.

Completed Projects

Some of the completed projects include the Decentralized Wastewater Treatment System (DEWATS) through GIZ, the Youth Development Center, and the Refugee Student Facilitation Center with UNHCR support.

Sports Directorate

The Sports Directorate at the University of Balochistan plays a vital role in promoting physical fitness, sportsmanship, and overall well-being among students. After renovations to the sports complex, including the University Gymnasium and Squash Courts the University provides outdoor and indoor games.

Kharan Campus:

The University of Balochistan sub campus Kharan was established in May 2017 and the academic activities started in October 2017. The sub campus Kharan has a total of three departments: Management Sciences, Computer Science and LLB. The new enrollment for the year 2024 was 88 students in all three departments. The total enrollment at Sub Campus Kharan is 237, with 151 male students and 86 female students which is growing further and it is expected that the enrollment in campus will cross the figure of 700 in next five years as the key objective of the establishment of sub-campus in remote areas to make accessible education for marginalized segments particularly females of the society without compromising on quality. Moreover, more than 87 students have already graduated and the majority of them are contributing to different national and international organizations as our esteemed alumni.

Extracurricular activities:

Extracurricular activities are important for the students in sub campus Kharan as they contribute to holistic development beyond academics. These activities enhance social skills, teamwork, and leadership qualities, providing a balanced education. They also help in stress relief, fostering creativity, and improving physical health. Engaging in extracurricular can boost campus applications and future career prospects, making students well-rounded individuals. These extracurricular activities conducted at University of Balochistan, Sub campus Kharan are mentioned below.

(i) Sports week:

The Sports week, held from 2nd January 2024 to 7th January 2025. Students participated enthusiastically in a variety of sporting events, including football, cricket, badminton, painting competition, musical chair game, race competition etc. The week fostered a sense of sportsmanship and healthy competition among students. The event culminated in a prize distribution ceremony where the winners were awarded with trophies, shields and medals.

(ii) Study tours:

The study tour, organized for students of sub campus Kharan, was a successful endeavor. The tour was held in June 2024. The tour aimed to provide students with practical exposure. The itinerary included visits to educational institutions, historic sites and recreational places of Quetta and Ziarat.

(iii) Awareness Sessions:

Sub Campus Kharan has organized several awareness sessions throughout the year 2024, covering critical topics on important issues. These sessions provided students with valuable insights. The sessions aimed to raise awareness about importance of education, foreign scholarships, social issues, health, crimes and safety and environmental concerns.

(iv) Welcome and Farewell Parties:

Welcome parties help students adjust to university life and build connections with their peers. The students of different departments arranged welcome parties for the new comers and farewell for the senior students who completed their degrees.

(v) Friendly matches (cricket/football) with other institutions of District Kharan.

(vi) Participation in debate/drama competitions frequently arranged by district/divisional administration etc.

Tree Plantation Event:

Tree plantation is crucial for maintaining ecological balance and combating climate change. Trees absorb carbon dioxide and release oxygen, which is essential for life. They help prevent soil erosion, support biodiversity by providing habitats for various species and regulate water cycles. Urban tree planting improves air quality, reduces urban heat and enhances the overall aesthetic and livability of cities. Keeping in view the importance of trees a tree plantation ceremony was observed in University of Balochistan Sub Campus Kharan in February 2024 in collaboration with District Forest Office Kharan.

Prime minister's youth laptop scheme:

It is matter of great pleasure for the students and staff of University of Balochistan Sub Campus Kharan that the number of applicants applied for award of laptop under Prime Minister's Laptop Scheme 2023, total 72 students have been sponsored and 100% students have received their laptops.

Beef scholarship:

Scholarships help talented and needy students who are financially weak and cannot afford the educational expenses. In the year 2024 BEEF Scholarship was granted to approximately 35 students of various departments of Sub Campus Kharan.

21st Convocation, University of Balochistan

The 21st Convocation of University of Balochistan was held on 21st November 2024. Degrees were awarded to 27 PhD scholars, 27 MPhil scholars, and 408 other graduates. Whereas 35 position holders were conferred with gold medals.

The Hon'ble Chancellor / Governor Balochistan, Hon'ble Pro-Chancellor along with other dignitaries graced the occasion.





Financial Health

Overall, the financial health of the University of Balochistan has improved compared to previous financial year as UoB share has been increased in university finance commission, the contribution for pension has increased. Whereas, In the beginning of 2024, the pension and endowment funds were exhausted but by the end of 2024 these funds were re-established.

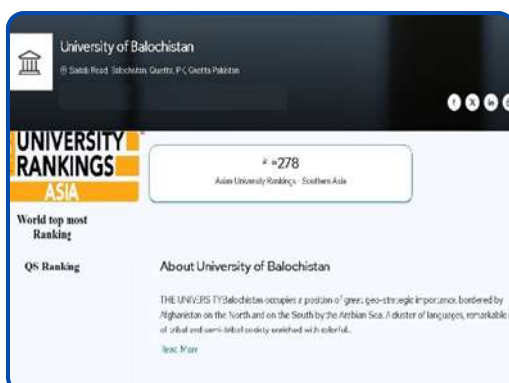
